



## **DECEMBER DEVOTION**

A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another.

#### John 13:34 (NIV)

Many of us have heard this command that Jesus gives his disciples. It is given to them on his final night on earth after he has washed their feet and predicted his death and Peter's denial. In fact, it is in the middle of the speech of Jesus predicting that Peter would deny him when he speaks this command. It is at a very poignant time that Jesus says this to his disciples as it is a great reminder that we are to love. But it is not just any love.

In the Bible there are 4 different kinds of love. They are 1) sensual love (eros), 2) familial love (storge), 3) brotherly/sisterly love that you share with a brother/sister from another mother (philia), and 4) the love God shows us (agape). This is the love that Jesus is commanding his disciples to show to others. This is not a love that is flimsy or one that goes by the way side. This is a love that is deep and contagious. This is the kind of love that when you show it to one person, another person is wanting it too.

To love one another as God loves us, we are to look past their imperfections and to look at them as God sees them. They are a person who is struggling with their own struggles. They need someone to show them kindness when no one else will. We also have to remember that we too are imperfect and if we want to receive God's love from others, then we must be willing to show it to others.

There is a great song that I am always reminded of with this verse: "They Will Know We Are Christians By Our Love." Actions speak so much louder than words. Show the love of God to all those around you.

We will then take a break until January 11 and start the revised schedule.




