



FEBRUARY DEVOTION

This is how we know what love is: Jesus Christ laid down his life for us.

1 John 3:16a

What does it mean to lay one's life down for another? It is the epitome of the definition of love. The Bible talks about agape love, the ultimate love that anyone can show another person. Having Ash Wednesday and Valentine's Day on the same day this year is a great reminder to us all about what love truly is. Jesus showed us what love is. First, he came to us as a baby and personally led us. Then, he sacrifices himself for us so that we are able to be forgiven of our sins. And so that we can live eternally in heaven with him. What better reminder for us?

It is a custom for several people to give up something. This is supposed to be something that will better yourself. This is also to help remind us of what Christ did for us, to give up his life for us. If this is your custom, I encourage you to give up something that is a challenge for you, but will make you a better person. Let it help you to be a reminder of the ultimate sacrifice. However, if it isn't your custom, that is fine too. But it might be something you try this year.

The Lenten journey is not meant to be easy. It is meant to challenge you as it was challenging for Christ. It is a long and arduous path. Each Sunday of Lent, the readings get a little ore dark. Palm Sunday, or as it is also referred to as Passion Sunday, is a day of celebration as Jesus enters Jerusalem riding on a donkey. However, by the end of week, it is a very different scene. Instead of cheers, there are shouts of angry men. Jesus has his Last Supper with his disciples, he was crucified and buried. We see a final scene that is very sad and depressing. We are grateful that is not where the story ends, but truly where it begins for us. This is what love is. This is how we should live our daily lives. To remember to give gratefully and wholly to what we believe is righteous. I pray that you will have a rewarding Lenten journey where you will be challenged and grow in your faith.
